


- I foster the integration of freshers inside the Luiss community, particularly upon their arrival at Luiss;

A completely ecological shuttle service is available for the University's students. The shuttles, running on natural gas, allow members of the Luiss community to




Procedures Before and After Arrival

RESIDENCE PERMIT FOR NON-EU STUDENTS

Non-EU students who intend to spend time in Italy for more than 90 days must request a residence permit – permesso di soggiorno – within 8 working days, Saturdays included, from the date of their arrival in Italy (as per the stamp on the passport or equivalent travel document). Students are responsible for applying for their own residence permit under Italian law.

Important information for students who need to apply for a residence permit: sometimes the difference between a visa and a residence permit is not clear for students who may believe that these two documents are identical and issued for the same purpose. They are two completely different documents!





	Visa	Residence permit		
What is it?	The visa is the document that allows non-EU citizens to initially enter Italy.	The residence permit is the document that allows non-EU citizens to live and study legally in Italy.		
When to apply?	Before entering Italy. We suggest that you apply several months before your arrival in Italy and contact the Italian Embassy/ Consulate in your country to know what the average time for the issuance of a study visa is.	Upon arrival in Italy (within 8 working days, Saturdays included). We recommend that you not wait until the last day to apply for the residence permit to avoid any further delay due to technical issues or closure of the post office.		
Where to apply?	At the Italian Embassy/Consulate in your country.	At the Sportello Amico counter at a post office located in the city where you live. The residence permit will be issued by the immigration office department of the Questura. Non-EU students will need to go to the immigration office twice in person: a first time to deliver the documentation requested and to have their fingerprints taken; a second time to collect their residence permit card although in this latter case it may suffice to go to a local police station instead.		
What format does it have?	A paper sticker containing personal data, photo, and reason for your stay, which will be applied to the passport or travel document.	A plastic card incorporating a chip containing personal data, photo and fingerprints that non-EU students should always carry with them (the residence permit allows non-EU citizens to stay legally in Italy).		
Duration	The duration of the visa may vary from 90 to 365 days.	The residence permit is valid for 1 year and then it must be renewed.		

HEALTH INSURANCE FOR NON-EU STUDENTS

Non-EU students need a health insurance policy to obtain a study visa and, once in Italy, to apply for a residence permit.

The health insurance policy must cover the entire duration of your residence permit, and it can last up to 1 year. If you are staying for a longer period, you will need to renew your health insurance policy every year along with the renewal of your residence permit.

To be valid for the purposes of applying for a residence permit, the health insurance policy must satisfy the following criteria under Italian law:

- I it has to cover any accident and hospital treatment not only in Italy but also in the Schengen Area;
- I its duration has to correspond to the period of your stay in Italy (if you expect to remain in Italy more than 12 months, you will need to renew it along with the residence permit);
- I a minimum coverage of € 30,000.

Please note that private insurance policies from home countries cannot be accepted by the Questura unless an official document

from the respective Italian Embassy or Consulate states that the policy is valid. If you decide to go for an Italian health insurance policy, we recommend contacting the following agency:

HOW TO OBTAIN ITALIAN NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE COVERAGE (BOTH NON-EU AND EU STUDENTS)

While making their travel plans for Italy, EU students holding a European health insurance card should check its validity and duration by contacting the institution in their country of residence that issued the card. If the actual duration of the card is shorter than the envisaged length of stay, students might wish to consider whether it would be best to take out a private

health insurance policy or register with the Italian national health service, which will allow them to access an affiliated general practitioner in the neighborhood in which they temporarily reside.

The list of doctors enrolled in the Italian national health service can be found at the nearest local health authority (ASL – Azienda Sanitaria Locale) or at any pharmacy. Students can contact the ASL of their area for information.

After collecting these documents, search for the ASL where you have to go based on your residential address.

You can check the ASL list above. Registration is valid for the calendar year, so we suggest that you register in January.

Students will have to renew their registration with the Italian national health system each year:

- I by paying the postal bulletin of 149,77€ at the Post Office;
- I by confirming the choice of their general doctor, which has to be done at the relevant ASL.

ROME CITY HALL REGISTRATION FOR EU STUDENTS

For periods exceeding three months, EU students need to register with Rome City Hall (Roma Capitale) through their local municipality (Municipio) based on where they are residing. Students should check their address at the following link to ascertain which Rome municipality they belong to: http://www.urbanistica.comune.roma.it/mappa-municipi.html#footer. Then they will need to fill in the dedicated form "Dichiarazione di Residenza" form, available on the Rome City Hall website, and bring it to the registration office of their local municipality, along with the following documentation:

- passport or equivalent travel document;
- I invitation letter (if you are a first-year student) or certificate of university enrolment, which you can request from the Student Office;
- I health insurance contract;
- proof of economic means of support (including through self-certification).

ITALIAN TAX IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (CODICE FISCALE)

An Italian tax identification number is an alphanumeric code that identifies you in all dealings, with public authorities and other bodies in Italy. A tax identification number is strictly personal. Non-EU and EU students must obtain an Italian tax identification number in order to register for the Italian national health service, to be able to open a bank account, to start a job or an internship, to buy a SIM card and so on. To obtain their personal tax identification number, students must go to the Italian Inland Revenue Agency (Agenzia delle Entrate), whose main office in Rome is at Via Ippolito Nievo 36 - (tel. 06 583191). The office is open from Monday to Friday from 8.15 a.m. to 12.15 p.m. Students can book an appointment at the following link: https://prenotazioneweb. agenziaentrate.gov.it/PrenotazioneWeb/ prenotazione.action

OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT

If you need/would like to open a bank account in Italy, you should submit the following documentation to the bank of your choice:

- I Italian tax identification number (codice fiscale see information above);
- passport or equivalent travel document;
- visa (for non-EU students);
- I invitation letter (if you are a first-year student) or certificate of university enrolment, which you can request from the Student Office;
- I residence permit or receipt for the appointment for a residence permit (for non-EU students);
- I proof of address (like a rental contract or, if you live in one of the university halls of residence, you can contact them at residenze-collegi@luiss.it);

Luiss University has an agreement with

Intesa San Paolo Bank, located at Piazza Bologna 45, 00162 Rome, which is recommended for all students who need to open an Italian bank account. The opening hours of the bank are Monday to Friday from 8.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m. and from 2.45 p.m. to 4.55 p.m. It is strongly recommended that students book an appointment in advance.

CITY OF ROME

Rome City Hall has a call center offering information about transport, public office hours, documents, garbage disposal, and more. This service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week in Italian and from Monday to Friday from 9.00 a.m. to 7.00 p.m. and Saturday from 8.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. in Italian and in English.

GETTING A SIM CARD FOR YOUR MOBILE PHONE

Several phone companies operate in Italy. The major providers in Italy are Vodafone, TIM, Windtre, Iliad and PosteMobile. You can go to any mobile phone store and ask to see their mobile phone plans. You can opt for either a plan (abbonamento) or pay-asyou-go (ricaricabile). For the latter you can purchase top-up cards from any tobacconist or newsstand all over the city. If you sign up for a plan, make sure you find out how much it costs if you cancel and how much notice you must give (if any).

GETTING AROUND

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Rome has an integrated public transport network that includes metro, bus, tram and urban railway service. There are 3 metro lines: A, B and C. HOW TO FIND YOUR TIMETABLE

You may search by degree program (corso di laurea), lecturer (docente) or course (insegnamento) – see figure 1. You can export your timetable to your personal calendar or as an Excel file.



Figure 2: example of search by degree program



Figure 3: example of search by lecturer



Figure 4: example of search by course


